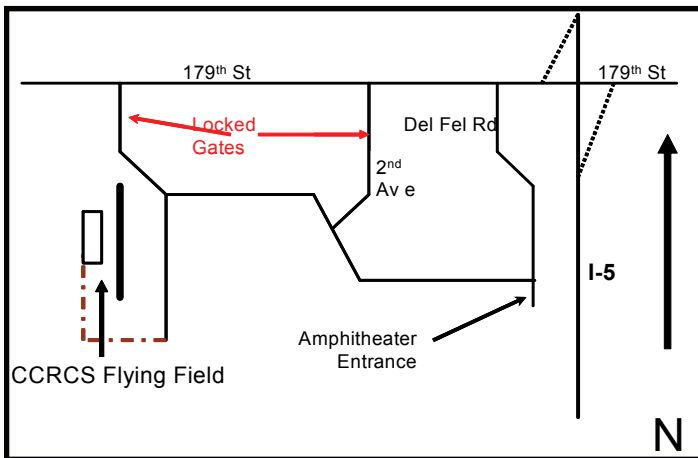

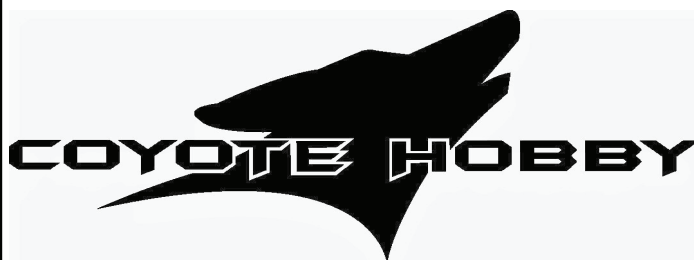

MEMBERSHIP APPLICATION FOR _____ (YEAR)

An Initiation Fee for new applicants and yearly dues must be paid when submitting this application, along with proof of current AMA membership. Proof of AMA membership requires presenting a current AMA membership card, or an online receipt for payment of renewal membership. Refer to www.modelaircraft.org, or call 800 435-9262.

Membership in CCRCs provides for the use of the club's airfield and facilities, access to organized club events, voting rights at club meetings and access to other special functions that may be provided throughout the year.

Dues:

The Initiation Fee is \$20 for new members or members that have not renewed for the current year. The deadline for club renewals is the last day of February. Junior AMA memberships are exempt from this fee.

Dues are \$56 per year, or pro-rated at \$4.67 per month. (For example: Joining in June requires dues of \$32.69 / 7 months x \$4.67.) Initiation fees are still required for pro-rated memberships.

Any renewal sent in before March 1 each year will be discounted by \$5.00. Any additional member(s) of the same household receives a 50% discount on dues. Any person holding a Junior AMA membership is charged \$1.00 per year with no Initiation Fee.

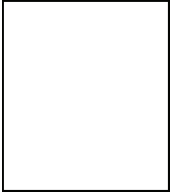

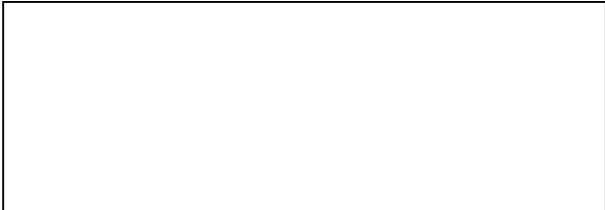
