The second event was combat with three HOR's ready to duel and with 2 late entries (Ted Atmore and his plastic plane and Corky with his Pattern plane). With waivers signed, the five took to the air, the first contact occurred when Ted and John Shirron had a mid air but since both planes stayed airborne the fight was still on. Apparently damage was done as John had to land and was out of it. Corky then swiped a ribbon from someone and had a ribbon on his plane till the end. At the end of the event Corky was declared a winner with one confirmed kill and Ted Atmore was second with a mid air.

The next event was precision dead stick. After climbing to 150 feet the engine was killed and the pilot had to land on a spot on the runway. The winner was Ted Atmore with Dave Yardes coming in a close second in the nitro division. Randy Boardman and Clint finished 1st and 2nd in the electric division.

The next event was called stop to stop and the goal was to race from one end of the runway to the other for time. Clay Cleveland finished first with a blistering time of 16 seconds. There was a three way tie for second (Clint, Corky

and Dave) and John came in last with 31 seconds.

The last event was the dreaded limbo where many a plane have been destroyed by the limbo pole. Fortunately there



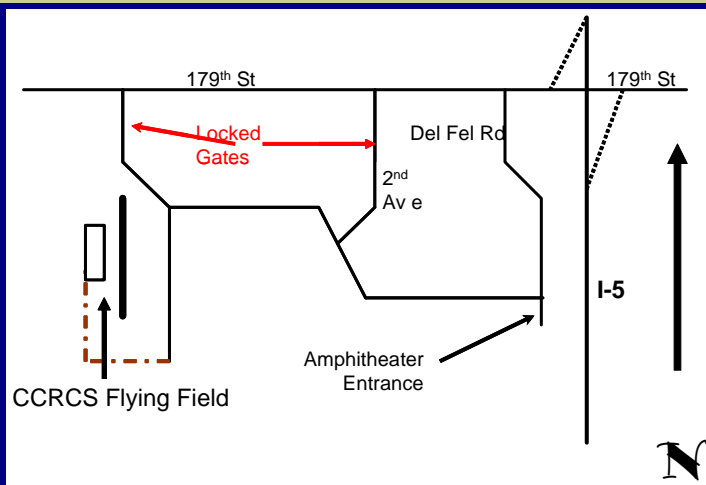
Ed Hagedorn and his impressive Carl Goldberg Chipmunk. Ed is holding the chipmunk in it's normal flying position. Inverted.

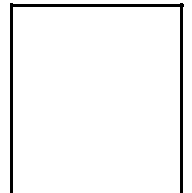
